UPDATE FROM OPERATIONS

FROM THE DESK OF BOB WISE

The Pandemic over the the last five months has presented challenges to our plants, customers and nation. I want to commend our team for a job well done taking precautionary measures to protect our employees at our operations. We cannot let our guard down because it remains a serious health concern for our nation. Continue to follow the guidelines Tony sent out and practice social distancing, wear protective masks, wash your hands and sanitize your work areas. If at any time you demonstrate any of the identified COVID symptoms don't come to work but rather contact Total Care and follow their recommendations.

Currently we are implementing two automation projects at our plants. At the Virginia Bolt Plant they are commissioning the hydraulic header, a project that has the potential to forge heads on bolts safer, more efficiently and at a reduced cost. At the West Kentucky plant, they installed the Automated Super Twist Line. It can produce torque tension bolts safer and more efficient than our current manual assembly lines. There are also plans to install automated assembly lines for both the M-3 inflatables and Friction-Lok bolts in Utah. These two projects are critical to fill the competitive demand of the western hard rock market. The Cresson Bolt and Fab Plant plan to install a Friction-Lok roll former, automated Friction-Lok assembly and an automated Pin Nut Assembly machine for the Canadian Market. I want to thank everyone on our team for all your hard work and good safety performance.

UPDATE FROM CIVIL

FROM THE DESK OF JACOB HUNTER

Throughout the year, JENNMAR stepped up and completed many challenging projects throughout the U.S. Our engineering and detailers took on the challenge of Goshen / Gering-Ft Laramie Irrigation Districts Tunnel No. 2 collapse in Wyoming and Nebraska, which threatened over 100,000 acres of farmland and crops. JENNMAR Civil delivered dozens of truckloads to support and reline the tunnel systems, working with the experienced contractor on site. JENNMAR also supplied the corrosion-resistant all-thread bar and resin rehab of the White Rock Tunnel in Sacramento. This tunnel is used by SMUD (Sacramento, Municipal Utility District) for the production of hydroelectric power. These are just a few examples of the unique projects completed over the course of this year, which helped to sustain and support the existing U.S. Infrastructure.

The spring and summer have brought about new challenges with the Covid-19 Pandemic. Project bid and Notice to Proceed dates have been pushed, which in turn has affected material orders. JENNMAR Civil has benefited from a strong backlog and the majority of projects considered to be "essential" by the municipalities/owners. The greatest delays existed with private tunnel projects, as owners are suspending the award of contracts due to the market uncertainties.

Moving into the fall and winter brings movement on several delayed projects, such as the LBNF Fermilab Project. On this project, JENNMAR has been supporting Kiewit/Alberici JV with ground support throughout the year. This project, funded by the DOE, provides research data for physics and accelerating laboratory experimentation. The two large caverns of PH1B are slated to kick off this fall, which brings tremendous opportunity for JENNMAR Civil to supply a domestic anchor for ground support. JENNMAR is also ramping up the production of structural steel for the OMNIS Bailey LLC Refinery Plant in PA. The DOE supports this project as well with the goal to include the use of clean coal for the production of raw materials for everyday use, similar to the cracking of oil. JENNMAR Civil will also begin producing the lattice girders and rock bolts for the Hartsfield Jackson Plane Train West Extension in Atlanta, GA. The tunnel will be used to decrease the cycle time of the transit system, which will increase the passenger total by 2,500 per day through the airport.

JENNMAR Civil will continue growing into the geotechnical industry and through traditional tunneling sales, including infrastructure, ventilation sales with Turnstone, and with illumination sales for tunnels that do not use steel ground support (the majority of tunnels in the U.S.). Texas and the Southeast will continue to be strong markets with the growth of population, with an increasing need for hydraulic and wastewater conveyance, and with water storage systems to mitigate areas impacted by flooding along the coastal and lowland regions. The Northeast, Midwest, and West regions will be a strong rehab market, with several large-diameter tunnels slated for bid in the next year. Canada's market has reopened, and with it comes new opportunities for SEM/NATM tunnels supported with lattice girders and rib/board tunnels.

The support and high quality of our production is of the up-most necessity, and we greatly appreciate the continued support of JENNMAR Civil throughout the company!



JM STEEL ANNOUNCES EXPANSION

OPERATIONS EXPAND INTO SINTON, TEXAS

Tony Calandra is pleased to announce that JM Steel will be expanding its footprint substantially over the next two years! Steel Dynamics, Inc. (SDI) has invited us to be part of their newest flat roll steel mill located in Sinton, Texas, just outside of Corpus Christi. The new mill will target an estimated 27 million tons of regional market-place driven by manufacturing, automotive, construction, transportation, and energy markets. The new Sinton mill will have an estimated annual capacity of 3.0 million tons, and boast "Next Generation" electric - arc- furnace (EAF) technology.

JM Steel's facility has plans to include three slitting lines capable of producing 30,000 tons of steel a month. Our first line will have capabilities of .500" x 84" @ 80,000 psi, with thickness ranging from .050" - .500". The slitter will be able to handle 105,000 lbs max coil weights and run up to 400 fpm. With these characteristics JM Steel will have the largest, most capable slitter in the United States. The plant and the slitter will be operational by June 30th, 2021. Plans in years three and four include lighter gauge slitter capabilities and additional value added services like laser cutting and press braking capabilities. The new facility will also boast two roll forming lines and a stamping press capable of producing 260,000 bolts per month to serve mining markets located in Mexico, Honduras, Costa Rica, Chile and Peru. The new location gives JM Steel Sinton excellent export opportunities to supplement its core ground control business of JENNMAR.
